All members must commit to the respectful acknowledgement that all people entering Manitoba Moon Voices Inc. carries valued purpose, gifts and strength that all may learn and benefit from. We commit to utilizing an innovative consensus - making process that will bring to bear knowledge and expertise from varied perspectives.

HONESTY

We commit to honestly knowing and speaking our intentions. We commit to ensure our intentions are not rooted in individual agendas but for the collective development and advancement of Manitoba Moon Voices Inc. and Indigenous women in Manitoba.

COURAGE

We must courageously commit to challenging our colonized ways of thinking and doing. We commit to collectively supporting each other to decolonize ourselves in all that we do within Manitoba Moon Voices Inc. and our circle. We collectively share this journey seeking to incorporate our ancestors and grandmother's guidance.

LOVE

We commit to honoring and valuing our differences and finding supportive ways to work together utilizing peoples strengths and gifts. We will be our strongest in creating change and transformation, for our families to empower ourselves and the work we do. We will reconnect to spirit and the land.

TRUTH

We commit to bringing the truth forward with our stories, experiences and reclamation of our voice collectively and inclusively. We commit to honoring our truth as Indigenous women, families, and Nations.

HUMILITY

We commit to modeling and acting with humility and integrity that honors the dignity and value in our families and each other. The work of Manitoba Moon Voices Inc. is guided by the value of reciprocity.

WISDOM

All Manitoba Moon Voices Inc. members carry wisdom to contribute to our work. The greatest wisdom leading our journey is the teachings of our ancestors, the ways of our culture, and the sacredness of our ceremonies. We commit to ensuring our work is grounded in the wisdom of our culture, customs and ceremonies – while being open to and honoring the different ways of all nations.

I would like to welcome everyone to our 10th Annual General Assembly. It has been my great pleasure to walk along this journey with you, the membership - our relatives for the past 8 years.

I want to begin by acknowledging the staff and board volunteers for their hard work and dedication, the good work we have completed in 2023/24 has always been a team effort and we all take pride in our heart work. Because of my teams hard work, this past fiscal year we added approximately 200 new members.

Our mission at Manitoba Moon Voices Inc. (MMVI) is to support and empower Indigenous women, girls, and gender-diverse individuals has let us continue with our programs like the Indigenous Skills and Employment Training Program (ISET), Reclaiming Our Power and Place Program (ROPAP) Raising Moon, Raising Voices and Taking the Next Step in our Journey.

As part of the empowering piece, I too have had the wonderful opportunity to take training with AFOA Canada, this has allowed me to gain the vital skills to continually work for the community.

April 2023

Manitoba Moon Voices Inc's Co-Chair attended the 22nd United Nations Permanent Forum on Indigenous Issues with the Native Women's Association of Canada

May 2023

At the beginning of May, Manitoba Moon Voices Inc published a Media Statement supporting the call for a National State of Emergency by the Gaganaawenimaanaanig MMIWG2S+ Implementation Committee.

Manitoba Moon Voices Inc proudly produced its first newsletter: DIBIKI GIIZIS DIBAAJIMOWINAN (Moon Telling Stories). Kathy Boulanger-Budd, MMVI administrative assistant, was offered tobacco to come up with the name of the newsletter.

Manitoba Moon Voices Inc started advertising for a Taking the Next Steps in our Journey Project Coordinator. Taking the Next Steps in our Journey is a new program that MMVI developed that would start in the Fall.

Manitoba Moon Voices Inc, with other community partners, sponsored the 2Spirit Honor Dance Special at the Manito Ahbee Festival Pow Wow.

We also sponsored the Sisters in Spirit Annual Mother's Day Walk, Honoring MMIWG2S+

We attended a land blessing and feast to honor the naming of a Winnipeg park after local warrior Leslie Spillett and her grand-daughter Izzy. The name of the park is Giizhigooweyaabikwe Park. Board Director Gayle Pruden danced at the event.

Manitoba Moon Voices Inc staff attended the Portage and Main Round Dance to honor Red Dress Day.

Manitoba Moon Voices Inc was able to provide free tickets to its members to attend the Winnipeg Comedy Festival at the Burton Cummings Theatre.

Manitoba Moon Voices Inc hosted two Drum Making Workshops in May.

At the end of May, we started another cohort of the Reclaiming our Power and Place Program.

June 2023

Kookum Gloria Karen Lalman was honored at Keeping the Fires Burning. Manitoba Moon Voices Inc was proud to be Gloria's sponsor organization. Gloria is a member of Peguis First Nation. She survived residential school and got her education. Gloria retired from government in 2015.

Manitoba Moon Voices Inc was invited by 2Spirit Manitoba to have a table at the Indigi-Mall at the Pride Festival at The Forks. We were also a sponsor for 2Spirit Pride.

At the end of June a Taking the Next Steps in our Journey Project Coordinator was hired.

August 2023

On August 4 Manitoba Moon Voices Inc published a Media Release calling on allies across Turtle Island to send us red dresses to honor the Missing and Murdered Indigenous Women, Girls and Two-Spirit-Plus community, for an event/ceremony that would occur on August 27.

On August 16 and 17, Manitoba Moon Voices Inc held our 2nd Annual Healing Journey Video Project at the Manitoba Indigenous Cultural Education Centre. The video vignettes produced from the August 16 and 17 story circles were being created to honor The National Day of Truth and Reconciliation on September 30.

On August 26, Manitoba Moon Voices Inc held its 9th Annual General Assembly. The theme and name of the 9th Annual General Assembly was Language is Healing.

On August 27, a Red Dress event was held at the Manitoba Legislative Building to honor the MMIWG2S+





At the beginning of September, Manitoba Moon Voices Inc held a one-day photoshoot with four MMIWG2S+ families. The annual project is called Honoring the Families of the MMIWG2S+. The images produced from the photoshoot are created to honor The Day of Action of the MMIWG2S+ on October 4.

The families included in the project are the Divas family, the Gerard Roussin family, the Harris family and the Myran family. In total, we published five images. Each image had a reference to a Call for Justice from the Final Report of the National Inquiry into the MMIWG2S+.

INDIGENOUS SKILLS AND EMPLOYMENT TRAINING PROGRAM ISET REPORT

I am happy to report to Indigenous Skills and Education Training Program had an exciting and successful year. Manitoba Moon Voices Inc (MMVI) sponsored 59 clients, 16 of which have completed their studies. 23 secured employment and 20 have returned for further education.

This year ISET is helping Indigenous women, girls, 2S, transgender, and gender-diverse individuals attain credentials in the following areas: Legal Assistant (1), Northern Social Work Program (1), Social Innovation and Community Development Program (1), Pathways to Health Program (2), Business Information and Technology Program (1), Justice Systems Certificate (1), Legal Assistant (1), Family Support Worker (7), Heavy-Duty Technician (1), Esthetics Diploma Program (1), Healthcare Aid Diploma Program (1), Business Administration Program (2), Healthcare Aid and Unit Clerk Program (1), Kinesiology (1), Environmental Technician (1), Social Service Worker Program (1), Bachelor of Education (1), Introduction to Trades Program (1), Medical Office Assistant Program (1), Education Assistant Program (1), Faculty of Law Program (1), Practical Nursing Program (1).

We provided Job Starts Assistance to 9 clients who received assistance with criminal record check, child abuse registry check, and vulnerable sector check, work clothing, transportation needs.

In addition, we hosted a First Aid and CPR Training facilitated by the First Aid Training Centre (Canadian Red Cross Training Partner). The training was delivered in person at our office. 10 women and gender-diverse individuals participated and completed the training. All clients were very thankful for the opportunity to take the training and the extra support that MMVI has assisted with. This training was very successful and has created a positive partnership with the First Aid Training Centre.

We continue to welcome our members and ensure that they are given the support and resources necessary to succeed!
